#### 4. LITHUANIA

**Discover Lithuania.** The Gem of Northern Europe Lithuania is a nation where a thousand years of history meet the technologies of the future. It is a country with a strong character, breathtaking nature, and hospitable people.

**General Information and Geography.** Lithuania is the largest of the three Baltic States, located at the geographical center of Europe.

**Neighbors.** We share borders with Latvia to the north, Belarus to the east and south, Poland to the southwest, and the Russian Federation to the west. The western part of the country is washed by the Baltic Sea.

**Population.** Lithuania is home to approximately 2.8 million people.

**Membership.** Lithuania is a full member of the European Union (EU), NATO, the OECD, and the Schengen Area. It is a safe, modern country built on Western values.

**Language and Technology.** A Unique Language: Lithuanian is one of the oldest surviving Indo-European languages, having preserved the most archaic features (similar to Sanskrit). It is a true treasure for linguists and a source of great national pride.

**Internet Leaders:** Lithuania boasts some of the fastest and most accessible fiber-optic internet and public Wi-Fi networks in the world. We are a hub for modern digital services and Financial Technology (FinTech).

**Cities, Waters, and Nature.** Major Cities: Vilnius – The capital, Kaunas, Klaipėda, Panevėžys, Šiauliai – The "City of Sun" in northern Lithuania, famous for the nearby Hill of Crosses. Waters: Lithuania is a land of waters. Our largest rivers—the Nemunas and the Neris. National Parks: We have 5 National Parks. Forests cover more than a third of the country.

**Climate.** Lithuania has a transitional maritime-continental climate. Here, you can experience all four seasons: Summer: Warm, sometimes hot (average +20–25°C). Autumn: Colorful, though often rainy and windy. Winter: Mildly cold, often decorated with snow (average -5°C, though it can drop below -20°C). Spring: Fresh and green, as nature wakes up from its winter sleep.

**Basketball** in Lithuania is more than just a sport—it is a source of national pride and unity. It is the most popular sport in the country, and our national team's achievements and the passion of our fans are known worldwide.

**Traditional Cuisine.** Lithuanian food is hearty, authentic, and made from local ingredients: Most Famous Dishes: Cepelinai (large potato dumplings), Kugelis (savory potato pudding), and the iconic bright pink Šaltibarščiai (cold beet soup). Dark Rye Bread: real, yeast-free rye bread is considered a sacred staple of our table. Curd (Varškė): This is one of the most important products in our kitchen. We produce unique white curd cheese (with caraway seeds, dried, or smoked), curd pancakes (varškėčiai), and sweet curd snacks. Beer (Alus): Lithuania has deep and ancient brewing traditions, especially in the northern region. Lithuanian beer is characterized by its distinct, archaic flavor and is highly valued by connoisseurs.



## 5. ŠIAULIAI

Šiauliai is a city in northern Lithuania, the fourth largest in the country, an administrative centre of Šiauliai County, with a population of approximately 112,600. It is an important economic and transportation hub.

The name of the city has been mentioned since 1236, in connection with the Battle of the Sun (Soule) against the Livonian Brothers of the Sword. In 1254, the land of Šiauliai (terra Saulen) is also mentioned in historical sources.

Places to visit in Šiauliai:

- **Cathedral of St. Apostles Peter and Paul.** When visiting the city for the first time, we always recommend starting from its heart — the Cathedral and the pedestrian boulevard. The Renaissance-style Cathedral of St. Apostles Peter and Paul serves as a landmark, guiding visitors to the very centre of Šiauliai.
- **Šiauliai Boulevard.** The main pedestrian street of the city. It is the most popular place for leisure, relaxation, entertainment, and shopping for both locals and visitors. Located next to the Cathedral of St. Apostles Peter and Paul.
- **Sundial Square.** A symbolic composition of the Sun and the Archer. The shadow of the sun moves across a giant dial, cast from an 18-metre-high obelisk topped by a running archer.
- **The Iron Fox.** A symbol of cleverness and wisdom. It is the largest animal sculpture in Lithuania. This impressive sculpture weighs nearly 7 tons, is about 15 metres long, 6.6 metres high, and 4.15 metres wide. Inside its steel heart, a capsule containing a message for future generations is hidden.
- **Hill of Crosses.** A major Christian pilgrimage site and a symbol of peace, featuring over 100,000 crosses that reflect the imagination of folk artists. In 1993, the Hill of Crosses was visited by Pope John Paul II.
- **Chocolate Museum.** Located in a former factory building, the museum offers an exhibition introducing the history of chocolate and revealing the secrets of its production. By booking the “Sweet Laboratory,” visitors can learn how to make various chocolate treats and enjoy them on site or take them home as souvenirs.
- **Cat Museum.** Home to more than 4,000 exhibits from all over the world, including Lithuania. Visitors are greeted by a friendly cat named Pearl, affectionately known as the museum’s “director.”
- **Bicycle Museum.** Dedicated to the history of the bicycle. Established nearly four decades ago, the museum combines traditional exhibitions with modern technologies. Every visitor becomes an active participant, learning about the history of cycling and trying out the opportunities and entertainment this mode of transport offers.



## 6. ŠIAULIAI ARENA

Šiauliai Arena is a modern, multifunctional complex for sports, cultural, and other large-scale and chamber events, located in the city of Šiauliai. The arena has a seating capacity of up to 7,400 spectators and was officially opened on 25 July 2007.

Address: J. Jablonskio Street 16, Šiauliai, LT-78162, Lithuania.

The arena meets both international and national safety standards and other requirements set by international indoor sports federations and leagues. Convenient parking facilities are available for visitors, with space for up to 600 vehicles at the same time.

Šiauliai Arena also houses sports schools and clubs, wellness and beauty centres, gym, aerobics and fitness facilities, a sports medicine office, cafés, bars, a restaurant, a souvenir shop, and a sports museum.

## 10. COMPETITIVE REGULATIONS

### KATA

- Only Shotokan KATA may be performed.
- KATA will be scored using **point system** with four corner judges and one centre referee.
  - Categories with more than 8 competitors will be classified for the **final out of 8**.
  - If there are up to 10 competitors, the final format will be decided by the** , the Organizing Committee.
  - 8 competitors - **direct final 1 Kata.**
  - If there are 8 or fewer competitors in a category - **direct final 1 Kata.**
- **In KATA TEAM** is the same system - TOKUY Kata - free all rounds
  - In the KATA TEAM may raise up to two Competitors of the Category immediately below
  - Each Competitor may only participate in a single Team of the same Category
- **Categories versus KATAS:**
  - 9 - 4 Kyu – Basic KATA (Heian Shodan to Tekki Shodan). 1 Kata in all Age Divisions, and can repeat the same in the Final.
  - In the categories **7-8 y/o 5 KYU and above** and **9-10 y/o 5 KYU and above** – Basic KATA (Heian Shodan to Tekki Shodan). 1 Kata, and can repeat the same in the Final.
  - 3 - 1 Kyu – Basic KATA or only (Bassai Dai, Enpi, Jion, Hangetsu, Kanku Dai)
  - In the category **11-12 y/o 3 KYU and above**, can only do the Brown Belt Katas or Basics.
  - Black Belt - TOKUY KATA
  - 3-1 Kyu and DAN - 2 KATAS. In the Final - different KATA, in all Age Divisions.
  - In the category “Open KATA Disability (073)”, all katas are permitted. Each athlete may perform only one kata

#### Awards:

- **1st** place: Championship Medal (Teams: Trophy and Medals)
- **2nd** and **3rd** places: Medals (Teams: Trophy and Medals)
- All participants will receive a Diploma.



## KUMITE

### ➤ **Protections:**

- Mouth piece is mandatory for all ages in the KUMITE event.
- Female chest protector is mandatory.
- Groin protector for all male competitors is mandatory.
- Only hand protectors (WKF type) are allowed (Blue or White and Red).
- Only safety glasses with a restraining band or soft contact lenses are allowed.
- Body protector (WKF type) in all categories (including 12 y/o and under) is optional.
- Head protector is optional.
- Foot and shin protectors are optional.

### ➤ **Children until 8 y/o**

- All rounds (including finals):
- Ippon shobu: 1 full point (Ippon) or two half points (Wazari)
- Time duration: 1 minute

### ➤ **Children 9 y/o – 12 y/o**

- All rounds (including finals):
- Ippon shobu: 1 full point (Ippon) or two half points (Wazari)
- Time duration: 1.30 minute

### ➤ **Cadets / Adults and Veterans (13 y/o and older)**

- All rounds (including finals):
- Nihon shobu: two full points – one full point and two half points or four half points
- Time duration: 2 minutes

### ➤ **Finals Adults 26–35 y/o Male and Female**

- Nihon shobu: two full points – one full point and two half points or four half points
- Time duration: 3 minutes

### **Awards:**

- **1st** place: Championship Medal (Teams: Trophy and Medals)
- **2nd** and **(2) 3rd** places: Medals (Teams: Trophy and Medals)
- All participants will receive a Diploma.



## 11. RULES

- All teams are requested to represent their home countries with dignity, and will be held responsible for any damages caused.
- Competitors not meeting the requirements will be not permitted to participate in the competition (and they will have no right to claim the participation fee back). Also, any competitors who miss out on their fights will not have the right to claim any of the participation fees back.
- For the competition, each athlete's age is calculated at date of Thursday, 22 October 2026. After the participation fee has been paid, the event organisers do not reimburse the costs.
- Each Kumite competitor must wear **belt** and **protectors** in the following colours:
  - Blue (or White) for shiro
  - Red for aka
- In case of need (insufficiency or excess of competitors per category), the organisers reserve the right to **join together or split** categories.
- During the event, only competitors and their coaches are allowed to be in the competition zones, and they will be required to wear their team outfit and a valid ID.
- All coaches and competitors must refrain from violent behaviour at all times. Otherwise, they will be asked to leave the competition zone immediately.
- All potential protests must be made in writing and filed immediately after a fight it is related to, and signed by an official team representative, after settling an appropriate Payment of € 120.
- All information missing in the rules and regulations of the championship explicit here, will be complemented by **FSKA tournament rules**.
- Event organisers do not bear responsibility for judges' verdicts.
- Event organisers are not responsible for any loss or theft of personal belongings.
- In case of doubt, the rules and regulations of the Lithuanian civil and penal codes will be observed.
- Participants: the number of participants is unlimited. By registering, all participants automatically confirm that they have checked their health condition and familiarized themselves with the championship regulations. All participants take part in the championship voluntarily, without any coercion, and assume all risks and responsibilities related to participation in the tournament (including, but not limited to, various health disorders, injuries, etc.), and undertake not to make any claims against the tournament organizers in this regard. The organizers of the competition are not responsible for the participants' health or any injuries sustained during the competition and recommend that athletes obtain personal insurance.
